## **10 Things You Can Do**

to Help Prevent Stormwater Pollution

- Use fertilizers sparingly and sweep up driveways, sidewalks, and roads
- Never dump anything down storm drains
- 3 Vegetate bare spots in your yard
- 4 Compost all yard waste
- 5 Avoid pesticides

- 6 Direct downspouts away from paved surfaces
- Wash your car on unpaved surfaces
- 8 Check your car for leaks and recycle all motor oil
- 9 Pick up after your pet
- Avoid over-salting in the winter
